2. General Information

2.1 General



The Netherlands is a European country located in between Belgium and Germany with the UK just across the ocean. The name The Netherlands translates to: 'The Low Lands', referring to 25% percent of the country laying below sea level. The fight to keep the water out of our land has resulted in the iconic canals in the inner cities and a very flat landscape with windmills. Even though Dutch is the official language, most people also speak English. Since the country is small, travel times are limited, so ideal for a short visit!

2.2 Dordrecht, the Netherlands

As of 2024, the City of Dordrecht, located near Rotterdam's harbour, continues to flourish with a population of approximately 121,000 residents. Dordrecht maintains strong economic and commercial connections with Rotterdam and has undertaken significant urban development in recent years.

The compact size of the Netherlands means that almost everything is within reasonable distance of each other. Throughout the country, there is a network of buses, trains, trams and metro that is efficient, modern and reliable. Bikes can also be rented at most train stations. With beautiful scenery, flat landscapes and some 15,000 kilometres of specially designated bicycle paths and routes, cycling in the Netherlands is not only practical but also enjoyable.

The city's "Sportboulevard," a central hub for sports and wellness, has grown in popularity. It includes facilities like a swimming pool, an ice rink, and indoor sports venues, supporting a variety of sports and recreational activities. The Sports Boulevard is part of the broader "Health Boulevard," which now features an updated hospital, shops, restaurants, and residential areas, creating a lively community space. Located conveniently close to major freeways and recreational areas, this boulevard is easily accessible, encouraging both community engagement and tourism.

2.3 Host City Location

Getting around the city

To travel to other cities in the Netherlands, Dordrecht's public transit options make it easy. Detailed routes and connections are available for seamless travel. Staying in the heart of Dordrecht allows for easy access to the city's main attractions on foot. A reliable rail network connects Dordrecht to major cities in all directions, though some transit connections may require brief transfers. Dordrecht's transit system offers passengers a convenient and comfortable way to explore the city and its surroundings.





2.4 Sportboulevard








50m Competition Pool

The pool is situated in the south of Dordrecht and was opened in October 2010. The main competition pool measures 50 by 21 meters and can be split into two equal parts each 25 meters by a retractable wall. The part on the right has a flexible floor that's approximately 10 meters long. It can be adjusted to any depth between 0 and 2,80 meters..

The pool has a large shower area and toilets which are directly connected to the entrance of the changing rooms. There are 8 communal changing rooms for 25 persons each. As a hygiene policy, the entrance for spectators is completely separate from the entrance of the athletes. Spectators can reach the stands via a stairway. The capacity is about 500 people. Teams can warm up in the sports hall and an allocated area in the pool



2.5 Visa Requirements

Most European Union (EU) and Schengen Area countries do **not** require a visa to enter the Netherlands for short stays (up to 90 days within a 180-day period).

2.6 Insurance

The following insurance is adviced or compulsory

- Travel Insurance
 Covers medical expenses, repatriation, and sports-related activities.
- Schengen Visa Insurance (for non european)
 Required with a minimum coverage of €30,000 for medical expenses and repatriation

Tip: Europeans can use their EHIC for medical care, but it does not replace travel insurance.

2.7 Additional Information

The official currency of the Netherlands is the Euro (EUR), with common exchange rates around €1 = USD1.07, €1 = GBP 0.83 and €1 = ZAR21.50 for South African Rand. The Netherlands uses the metric measurement system and drives on the right-hand side of the road.

The electrical current in the Netherlands is 230V, 50Hz, with plug types C and F, which both use two round pins.

In August, the average temperature is around 18°C, with relative humidity averaging about 80%. UV levels typically range from 3-7 but may fluctuate due to frequent cloud cover. Sunscreen is advisable on sunny days if you'll be outside for long periods.

Dordrecht is approximately 1 meter above sea level.

3.5 Playing Cap and Swimsuit approvals

These requests must be submitted to the CMAS UWH Events Directors by email before 31st March 2025 via uwh-approvals@sport.cmas.org.

Please use Cap and Swimsuit Approval Request in your email request subject line.

As per Clause 3.2.1 All players of a team must wear identical bathing attire (cap, suit and/or rash vest and/or shirt), which may have an imprint of their flag or country. Each team must have two sets of identical bathing attire, one light in colour (when the team is using white sticks) and one dark in colour (when the team is using black sticks), and both sets need approval prior to arrival at the competition.

Swimsuits

- o Light Colours: White, Yellow, Light Blue, Light Grey, Orange.
- o Dark Colours: Black, Blue, Royal Blue, Navy Blue, Grey, Brown, Green, Red

> Playing Caps:

- o White Caps: Must be White with white ear protection and Black/Blue numbers
- Dark Caps: Must be Blue/Black with Blue/Black ear protection and White numbers
- o Cap Numbers: Cap numbers are limited to numbers between 1 and 15.

3.6 Player Selection and Replacement

Teams are limited to 12 players and must be selected before the submission of the team list and player profiles on the 1st July 2025. Players may be replaced between the 1st July and tournament registration on medical grounds only. This provision is to limit the increased work load on volunteer organisers.

3.7 Additional Training Space

Teams that wish to arrive earlier than the allocated orientation and training days are welcome to do so on the 15th to 16th of August 2025. Charges to be paid by the teams are:

Court price is Euro €125 for 30minutes per court. Slots are available from 7am to 9pm.

In 2025 you can book the courts on the website www.europeafricauwh2025.com.

The day before the start of the tournament, August 17th, is allocated training time. The Technical Delegate will give slots to teams based on the alphabetic order of the IOC Country code.

3.8 **Registration and Meetings**

Registration, documents check and delivery of accreditation will be undertaken at the swimming pool venue for all teams. The registration and meeting will take place at the Sportboulevard.





3.9 **Opening Ceremony**

Opening ceremony of CMAS 1st Intercontinental Underwater Hockey Championship (Europe/Africa) will be held on the 17th August 2025 at Sportboulevard.

3.10 Awards and Closing Ceremony

Awards and closing ceremony of the CMAS 1st Intercontinental Underwater Hockey Championship (Europe/Africa) will be held on the 23rd August at 18:00 pm. at the Pool at the conclusion of the finals.

3.11 **Post Event Celebration**

The post event party will commence at on Saturday 23rd August 2025 at the sports Hall next to the entrance of the Sportboulevard. 14 tickets per team entry is provided with the registration. Extra entry tickets will cost 40 Euro which can be paid at time of entry

4.2 Referees

Each team must supply one Level 3 water referee. The tournament needs 28-32 suitable water referees to successfully officiate 2 matches at once.

Penalty fee for non-supply of referee is 1st referee €3000, 2nd referee €2000 and 3rd referee €1000 i.e. A country sending 2 teams and no referees then the non- supply of referee levy is €5000 All Referees must pass the referee in water beep test to be considered for assessment on the 19th August during the referee fitness test.

4.3 Referee Accommodation and Transfers

The cost of Accommodation, food and transport for referees will be covered by the Event Budget during the length of the event, $17^{th} - 23^{th}$ August 2025. Referees arriving earlier than the allotted schedule will bare the cost of accommodation.





5. Team Entry Fees

5.1 Team Registration and payments to the LOC

On the tournament website www.europeafricauwh2025.com you will find all the links you need to complete the registration of teams and make payment of entry fees, paid training and extra function tickets.

Team managers will receive an email invite to join the Team Managers WhatsApp group.

5.2 CMAS Athlete Licenses and Enrollment

All athletes must register for the CMAS championship via the online CMAS Portal https://portal.cmas.org/. Your Underwater Federation has the login codes and passwords and will undertake this registration process for you.

The first step is for athletes to create their individual profile (including their profile picture) and request acceptance from the Federation.

Cost is approximately €14 per athlete license.

All athletes are required to have their valid CMAS license in order to be able to enter into the competition area. Sports Licenses requests must be applied for via the online CMAS portal system also.

Federations will need to enroll all athletes and team offcials

5.3 **Tournament Entry Fee**

The entry fee is set at €4500 per team. The due date for entry fees is before 1st March 2025.

The late entry fee is set at €500 per team ie €5000 per team for payments received between 1st of December 2024 and 31st January 2025. No late entry will be accepted after the 31st of March 2025.



Transport and Accommodation

6.1 **Transportation**

Transport is not only convenient within the Netherlands but there is also a variety of options to get to the Netherlands.

By air

Amsterdam Airport Schiphol is a modern, efficient and user-friendly airport. As Schiphol is one of Europe's largest transfer hubs, flights from all over come into Schiphol. Schiphol Station is located directly below the airport and by train, you can travel to various locations within the Netherlands.

By train

The train from Schiphol Airport to Amsterdam Central Station takes about 15 minutes. The train ride from Schiphol station to Dordrecht Central station takes about 1:10 hours and costs €18,00 per person. The additional train ride from Dordrecht Central Station to Dordrecht Zuid station takes about 3 minutes and costs €2,60 per person. From Dordrecht Zuid it is an 8-minute walk to the pool.

Trains also connect the Netherlands with the UK, France, Belgium and Germany.

By boat

Most travellers go overland through Belgium and France to catch a boat to England. Ferries also run between the Hoek van Holland (Hook of Holland) and Harwich, UK; Europoort (near Rotterdam) and Hull, UK; IJmuiden (near Amsterdam) and Newcastle, UK; and IJmuiden and Kristiansand, Norway.

By road

Teams from closer by might opt for driving to Dordrecht. For countries in West Europe, this might be an attractive option. From Nice the driving time is 13 hours, from Paris 5 hours, from Milan 11 hours, from Zurich 8 hours, from Munich 8 hours, from Prague 10 hours, from Warsaw 13 hours and from Brussels 1.5 hours.





6.2 **Accommodation**

During the championship, about 600 people are expected to come to Dordrecht. To ensure that there is enough space for people to stay, a list of the largest hotels and hostels is given below. In the hostels groups of people can be accommodated per room.
