About the City of Zhanjiang



Zhanjiang is located at the southernmost tip of the Chinese mainland, in the southwestern part of Guangdong Province, where Guangdong, Hainan, and Guangxi meet. It is one of the first 14 coastal cities in China opening up to the world and is positioned as a key growth pole in the modern coastal economic belt, a sub-central city of Guangdong Province, one of the country's first pivotal cities for maritime cooperation under the Belt and Road Initiative, a national integrated transportation hub, and the central city of the Beibu Gulf region. Zhanjiang has earned titles such as "Top Tourist City of China," "National Garden City," and "National Hygienic City." The city covers a total area of 13,300 square kilometers and has a permanent population of 7.1208 million. It administers four districts and two counties and oversees three county-level cities. In 2024, the city's GDP reached RMB 383.993 billion, an increase of 1.2%. In the first half of 2025, its GDP was RMB 181.126 billion, growing by 5.1%.

Zhanjiang is a provincial sub-central city with enormous development potential. In 2018, General Secretary Xi Jinping entrusted Zhanjiang with the major missions of "building a key growth pole in the modern coastal economic belt" and "advancing in coordination with Hainan." In April 2023, General Secretary Xi Jinping inspected Zhanjiang and clarified the direction for the city's development. The Communist Party of China (CPC) Guangdong Provincial Committee and the Guangdong Provincial Government have provided practical support for Zhanjiang in "building a provincial sub-central city." At present, Zhanjiang is steadily advancing its own practice for the Chinese path to modernization, focusing on building a city with industrial strength and a pleasant ecology, known for social security, good food, morality, and happiness. Industrial projects valued at over RMB 100 billion each, such as Baosteel Zhanjiang Iron & Steel, Zhongke Refinery & Petrochemical, BASF, and Lianjiang Nuclear Power, are accelerating construction or increasing production efficiency. Zhanjiang is entering a fast track of revitalization.

Zhanjiang is a national integrated transportation hub. With a comprehensive transport system that includes maritime, air, rail, and road transport, it is a member of the New International Land-Sea Trade Corridor and a national strategic pivot for modern logistics. Zhanjiang Port, the first modern port independently designed and built after the founding of the People's Republic of China, has been upgraded into a world-class deep-water port capable of accommodating 400,000-ton vessels. Zhanjiang Wuchuan International Airport is the only trunk-line airport in western Guangdong. The Jiangmen-Zhanjiang section of the Shenzhen-Zhanjiang High-Speed Railway is already in operation; the Guangzhou-Zhanjiang High-Speed Railway will be completed within the year; construction has begun on the Hefei-Zhanjiang High-Speed Railway. These indicate that a pattern of "five high-speed rail lines converging in Zhanjiang" is rapidly taking shape. The total length of roads open to traffic in the city reaches 23,062.5 kilometers.

Zhanjiang is a resource-rich tropical coastal city. Surrounded by the sea on three sides, it has a mainland coastline stretching 1,195.26 kilometers. Its marine resources are abundant, and its total aquatic production and output value have ranked first in Guangdong Province for 30 consecutive years. It is known as the "Chinese Capital of Seafood Cuisine" and the "Chinese Capital of Prawns." The city is rich in tropical and subtropical crops and is China's largest production base for eucalyptus and sisal, as well as an important production base for sugarcane, fruit, and vegetables. Zhanjiang also has a diverse range of mineral resources. Its tourism resources are distinctive, featuring the Huguangyan Ma'er Lake World Geopark, the largest offshore coral nature reserve, and the largest national-level mangrove nature reserve in the country.

Zhanjiang is a city with strengths in science, education, and technology. Leizhou culture is one of the four major cultural traditions of Lingnan, and Leizhou is a national historic and cultural city in Zhanjiang. The city is also honored with multiple items of national-level intangible cultural heritage. The Zhanjiang Bay Laboratory has been completed and put into operation. Several innovation platforms are under construction, such as the National High-Tech Industrial Development Zone and the "Western Guangdong Data Valley" Big Data Industrial Park. The city is home to 547 high-tech enterprises and more than 540 research and development institutions. Zhanjiang also has abundant educational resources, including six regular higher education institutions and 27 secondary vocational schools.



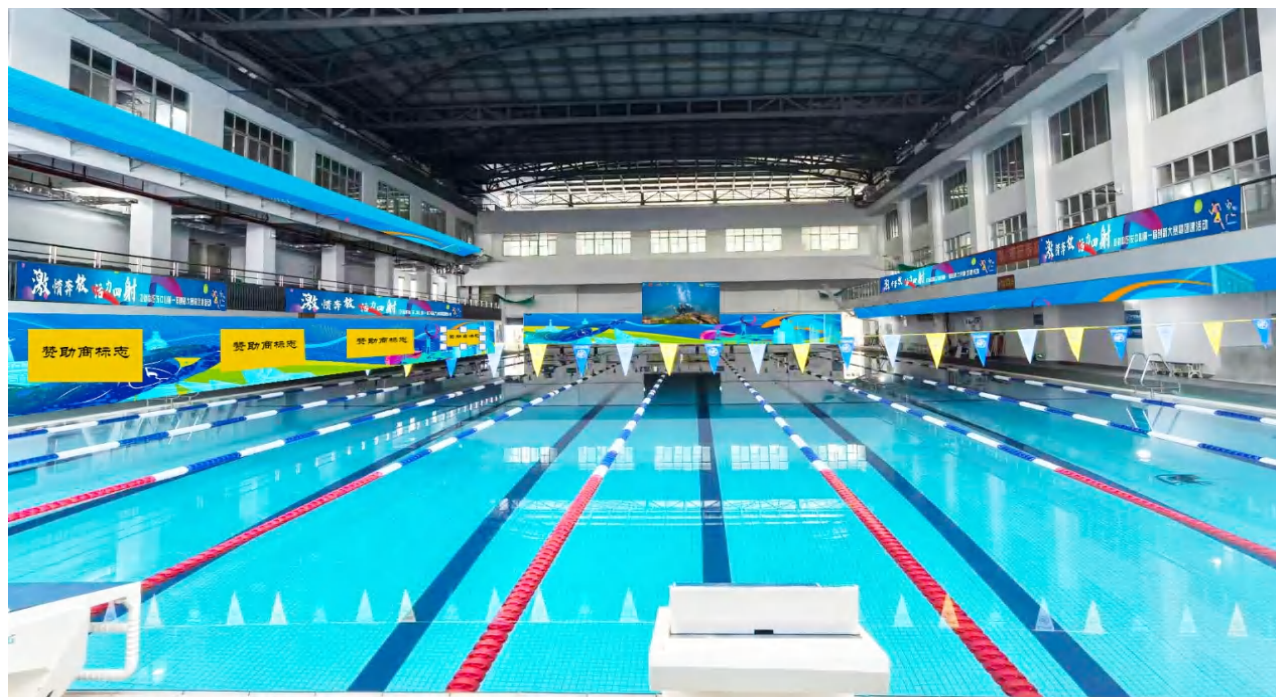
2/ About the Zhanjiang Underwater Sports School of the General Administration of Sport of China

History: In March 1961, under the plan of Marshal He Long, then Director of the National Sports Commission, and General Li Da, then Director of the National Defense Sports Association, the National Sports Commission established the China People's Underwater Club, the predecessor of the school. In 1975, the China People's Underwater Club was renamed the Zhanjiang Underwater Sports School of the National Sports Commission. In 2001, it was renamed the Zhanjiang Underwater Sports School of the General Administration of Sport of China.

Infrastructure: The base and main campus of the school covers approximately 88,000 square meters (130 mu), with a total floor area of about 55,000 square meters. It is equipped primarily with "three complexes and four fields": a finswimming pool, a diving pool, an integrated training hall, an athletics field, a football field, a tennis court, and a basketball court. The campus also includes three athlete dormitory buildings and auxiliary facilities. The Huguangyan Training Base of the school is located within the 4A-rated Huguangyan Scenic Area. It features all kinds of training support facilities, including a waterskiing complex, a boathouse, and a pier.

Staff: The school has a staffing quota of 52 positions. Currently, it employs 37 staff members within the staffing quota and 25 contract-based employees, as well as 31 contract-based employees at the Sports Injury Medical Center.

Functions and Responsibilities: The mission of the school is to guide the development of finswimming and waterskiing and to promote the advancement of sports. Its responsibilities include organizing and conducting training programs for finswimming and waterskiing coaches and athletes; organizing finswimming and waterskiing training, performances, and competitions; providing training for relevant management personnel; and offering venues, research support, and logistical services for resident training teams. In recent years, the school has successfully fulfilled service and support tasks for resident training teams, as well as competition preparation duties, for multiple sports, including finswimming, waterskiing, diving, water polo, rugby, and



triathlon.

The Zhanjiang Underwater Sports School has significantly enhanced its capacity to bring honor to the nation. The para freediving, finswimming, and waterskiing teams that it led in training, service, and support won seven gold medals, two silver medals, and one bronze medal at the Chengdu World Games, breaking three world records and contributing 20% of China's gold medals. Its project promotion and popularization are in full swing. The first national winter and summer camps for finswimming, waterskiing, and diving attracted more than 400 young participants from 10 provinces, with a total of over one million views online. Nationwide programs to popularize finswimming, waterskiing, and diving, as well as the selection process for the China Junior Waterskiing Team, are about to be launched. The school provides diverse fitness-for-all activities. Its "three complexes and four fields" are open an average of 350 days per year, host more than 20 competitions and events, and receive over 200,000 fitness participants annually. The Medical Center handles more than 25,000 patient visits each year, all reaching historic highs. The school fully leverages its multifaceted sports functions. It has proactively worked with the CPC Zhanjiang Municipal Committee and the Zhanjiang Municipal Government. The Vice Governor and the Secretary of the CPC Municipal Committee have inspected the school three times. The school leads four task forces for local cooperation in Zhanjiang, contributing to the city's development as a high-quality outdoor sports destination. The Sports-Tourism Integration Project of the Military Culture Park has begun physical operations, and the Zhanjiang International Underwater Competition will be held in late November 2025. Its capacity for self-development continues to strengthen through optimized resource allocation and revitalization of idle assets. The school's revenue pillar has expanded beyond venue leasing toward diversified services, including training support, competitions, and training programs.

3/ Competition Overview

The competition is divided into two categories: Senior and Junior. Both categories include the following events: 50 m Apnea (AP), 50 m Bi-fins (BF), 50 m Surface Finswimming (SF), 100 m BF, 100 m SF, 100 m Immersion (IM), 200 m SF, 200 m IM, 200 m BF, 400 m BF, 400 m SF, 400 m Immersion, 800 m SF, 1500 m SF, 4×50 m SF, 4×100 m SF, and 4×200 m SF, with all events held separately for female and male. In addition, there will be a 4×100 m BF Mixed and a 4×100 m SB Mixed. The competition will run for four days, with a total of 150 athletes participating.

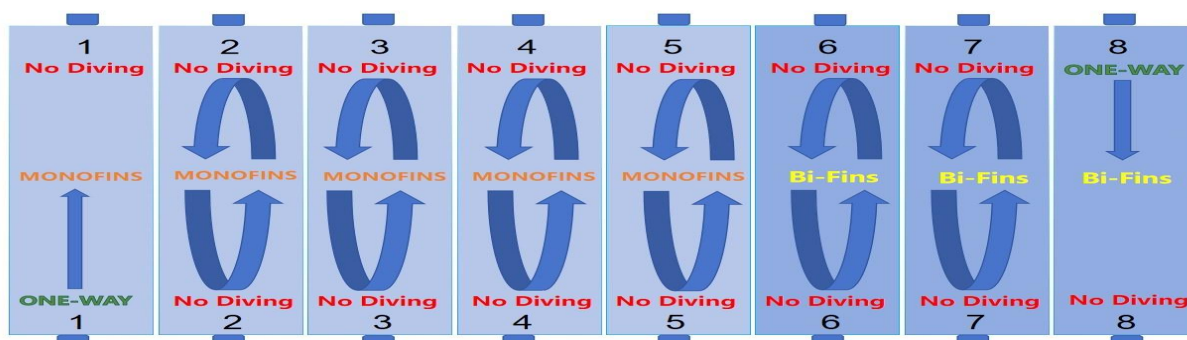

4.3 About the Menu

4.3.1 The restaurant primarily serves Chinese cuisine and provides three buffet meals daily.

4.3.2 All dishes are labeled bilingually (Chinese-English), indicating the dish name and main ingredients.

4.4 Special Services

If athletes or officials are unable to dine in the restaurant due to injury or illness, their teammates or colleagues may collect their meals at the restaurant service counter by presenting a medical certificate and signing a food safety consent form when taking meals out.

4.5 Notes

Individuals may enter the restaurant for meals during serving hours by presenting their accreditation card. Food from outside is not allowed in the restaurant.

4.6 Competition Venue

4.6.1 Drinking Water Service

During the competition, drinking water will be provided in the athlete and official rest areas from one hour before competition until the end of competition, from the first day of competition to the final day. During training, drinking water will also be provided in the athlete and official rest areas throughout the training, from the first training day to the final training day.

5/ Accommodation Service



Days Inn by Wyndham Zhanjiang Seaview Promenade is a high-end business and resort hotel that opened in 2025 and is operated by the globally renowned Wyndham Hotels & Resorts. Located at No. 42 Haibin Avenue, Xiashan District, Zhanjiang (within the Zhanjiang Underwater Sports School of the General Administration of Sport of China), the hotel is dedicated to providing business and leisure travelers with a high-quality accommodation experience and convenient, attentive services.

Days Inn by Wyndham Zhanjiang Seaview Promenade officially welcomes guests in 2025. Designed and furnished according to high-end standards, it integrates comfortable guest rooms, multi-functional meeting spaces, and diverse dining options into a comprehensive business and resort destination renowned in Zhanjiang. The hotel has 158 guest rooms. With its prime location, convenient transportation, well-equipped facilities, and a wide range of dining and entertainment options, it has become one of the most popular accommodation choices for visitors to Zhanjiang.

The hotel is situated in the heart of Xiashan District, within the Underwater Sports School of the General Administration of Sport of China. It is within walking distance to popular attractions such as the Seaview Promenade, Seaside Park, and the Former French Legation. It is also near two major shopping centers-Dingsheng Plaza and Rongji Plaza-and just 100 meters away from Changdachang Supermarket (Seaside Branch). The surrounding area offers a wide range of dining options, from local snacks to traditional specialties, easily satisfying all kinds of culinary preferences.

In terms of transportation, the hotel is approximately 41.5 kilometers from Zhanjiang Wuchuan International Airport, about a 40-minute drive, and 18 kilometers from Zhanjiang Railway Station. Multiple bus lines serve the area, making travel highly convenient.



Medical Services

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6.1 During the competition, the event will provide all registered participants with full-process medical services, including medical care at the venue, emergency transport, and inpatient treatment at designated hospitals.

6.2 City Emergency Medical Number: 120

6.3 Medical facilities will be set up at the venue, on the sidelines, and at the hotel to provide on-site medical treatment.

6.4 Ambulances will be available for emergency transport services. Medical facilities open one hour before the competition and close one hour after the competition ends or after the last athlete leaves.

Routine medical services are available at 9:00-12:00 and 16:00-19:00. Emergency and transport services are available 24 hours a day.

6.5 Designated Hospitals

A designated hospital and a nearby treatment hospital are set and prepared with green channels and reserved beds. Athletes must present their accreditation card when seeking treatment.

6.5.1 Nearby Treatment Hospital: The large general hospital closest to the venue. In emergencies or sudden incidents, athletes or other injured individuals will be transferred here for immediate care. If deemed necessary by medical staff, patients will be further transferred to the designated hospital.

6.5.2 Designated Hospital: A large hospital equipped with specialized critical care capabilities that provides 24-hour medical services.

6.6 Informed Consent for Diagnosis and Treatment

During the competition, all medications or related non-drug treatments used by athletes require signing the Competition Medical Treatment Informed Consent Form (Form 1). Athletes have the right to refuse treatment or medication.

In accordance with anti-doping regulations, athlete medication must strictly follow the approved medication list, as detailed in the Competition Medicine List (Form 2). Medications intended for other personnel are prohibited from use by athletes (except in emergency rescue situations) to ensure safe medical care and drug administration. Following the principles of Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE), if prohibited medications or methods are used for treatment of competing athletes, the doctor, athlete, or team physician from the National/Regional Olympic Committee or sports organization must fill in the Competition Informed Consent for Use of Doping Substances (Form 3).

6.7 Medical Expenses

The Organizing Committee will provide all registered participants with free on-site medical treatment and emergency transport services during the competition. The policy applies only to medical costs incurred within China. Medical expenses outside this period or scope will not be covered by the Organizing Committee.

7/ Anti-Doping Checks

7.1 Overview

To ensure the health of athletes, and fairness and equality, this event will conduct anti-doping checks. Any athlete may be required to undergo anti-doping checks (including urine and blood tests) at any time during the event.

7.2 Check Requirements

After receiving the anti-doping check notification from official authorized personnel, athletes must actively cooperate. Evading, refusing, or failing to complete sample collection will be suspected of an anti-doping violation.

7.3 Policy and Regulations

Athletes and support personnel should understand and comply with all applicable anti-doping policies and rules established under the *World Anti-Doping Code* and the *2025 IWGA Anti-Doping Rules*. All standards involving anti-doping checks will be strictly carried out in accordance with the relevant rules of WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency), IWGA (International World Games Association), and ITA (International Testing Agency).
