

2026 CMAS WORLD CUP SPEARFISHING

SAGRES, PORTUGAL





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1. GENERAL

1.1. LOCAL ORGANISATION COMMITTEE

The Portuguese Federation of Underwater Activities (FPAS) and M.A.R. – Maresia Associação Recreativa (MAR) are the local organisation committee of the 2026 CMAS WORLD CUP SPEARFISHING, SAGRES - PORTUGAL, to be held from 2 to 6 September 2026, in Sagres, Vila do Bispo, Portugal.



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1.2. PARTICIPATION CONDITIONS

The 2026 CMAS WORLD CUP SPEARFISHING is an competition with 3 categories Men, Women and Master 50+. The participations conditions are:

- 1.2.1. All the teams are registered by clubs in the CMAS Portal (portal.cmas.org).
- 1.2.2. Do not exist maximum number of teams per country / National Federation.
- 1.2.3. All the teams have a maximum of 3 athletes in one boat.
- 1.2.4. Any spearfishing athlete, male or female, over the age of 18, may participate.
- 1.2.5. The Male team is constituted by a maximum of 3 male athletes.
- 1.2.6. The Female team is constituted by a maximum of 3 female athletes.
- 1.2.7. The +50 Masters team is constituted by a maximum of 3 male or female athletes older that 50 years old.
- 1.2.8. All the athletes need to be affiliated to a National Federation recognised by CMAS (exception in the case of nations that do not have National Federations affiliated with CMAS).
- 1.2.9. Due to the limited number of boats, ONLY 30 TEAMS are guaranteed participation.
- 1.2.10. All teams must bring their club flag, country flag and respective national anthem. Teams that do not present the items requested in this point during Check-in will be penalised with 10% of the day's points.
- 1.2.11. All team members must wear identical uniform, consisting at least of a shirt and shorts/trousers. Teams that do not wear uniform during the opening parade and the weigh-in will be penalised with 10% of the day's points.

1.3. RULES

The rules will follow the SPEARFISHING INTERNATIONAL RULES, BoD227-06/04/2023 / dated 30-06-2023. The species list will be in accordance with the annex I.

2. REGISTRATION

2.1. Registration Procedure

Teams wishing to compete in the World Cup must:

1. Registration in the CMAS Portal (portal.cmas.org)
2. Registration with the LOC sending the annexs and payments proof by email.

2.1.1. The registration fee includes:

- Organisation and general expenses of the World Cup & Master 50+.
- CMAS Athlete fee (25,50€).
- Official ceremonies and official dinners: opening day and closing day.

2.1.2. The registration fee do not includes:

- Hotel accommodation
- Boat for each team, during two (2) competition days.
- Fuel for boats on competition days. All teams are responsible for fuelling their own boats.

4. THE 2026 CMAS WORLD CUP SPEARFISHING

4.1. Categories and Duration

The 2026 CMAS WORLD CUP SPEARFISHING will have 3 different categories: Triple Men, Triple Women and Triple Master 50+.

4.2. ANTI-DOPING CONTROL

During the competition, anti-doping control may be carried out, in accordance with CMAS and WADA rules.

4.3. Duration

- 4.3.1. Five (5) hours, along the coast in the Sagres area.
- 4.3.2. The CMAS Technical Delegate may, if deemed necessary, reduce the duration of the competition day from the originally planned schedule, either during the day itself or at its start, for safety reasons, if weather conditions are adverse.
- 4.3.3. A competition day will be considered valid if the elapsed time exceeds two thirds of the time initially planned for that day.
- 4.3.4. The World Cup will be considered valid when at least one valid competition day is completed.
- 4.3.5. The total suspension of a competition day is the exclusive responsibility of the CMAS Technical Delegate.

4.4. Geographical Area

- 4.4.1. This geographical area will be divided into three (3) zones called "Competition Zones", with two (2) main zones where the competition will take place and one (1) reserve zone, in case weather conditions make it unsafe to operate people and boats in the main zones. These areas will be designated Zone A, Zone B and Reserve Zone.
- 4.4.2. The CMAS Technical Delegate will confirm the order of competition zones no later than one hour before the start of the first competition day.
- 4.4.3. The official visit period, without fishing and without spearguns/weapons in the water, is two weeks = 14 days + the day before the start of the World Cup = 15 days, i.e., from 20 August until the competition day.
- 4.4.4. it is prohibited to:
 - a. Access the competition zones the day before the start of the event by all competitors, delegation members, captains and any persons related to them.
 - b. Visit any competition zone during the official visit period using autonomous diving equipment (tank), except on breath-hold, or using scooters or any other underwater propulsion device.



4.5. Boats

- 4.5.1. Teams may only use the boat provided by the LOC or their own boats previously accepted at the time of registration, which will be considered official boats. Any other means of transport is prohibited during competition time.
- 4.5.2. Each team will have one official boat at their disposal. Considering that boats may vary in size and power, in this event:
 - a. Available boats, excluding those of teams with own boats accepted by the organiser, will be distributed by draw.
 - b. Captains may remain on one of the boats assigned to their team and are allowed to change from one boat to another during the competition day.
 - c. In case of breakdown, the boat will be replaced if possible. No complaints will be accepted regarding the replacement boat.
 - d. Teams using their own boat must present written communication at the time of registration. Boats with a maximum power of 150 HP are permitted.
 - e. Each official boat will have a reference number corresponding to the team number. This number will serve as identification in radio communications during the competition.
 - f. Competitors may not change boats.

4.6. Training Period and National Law

- 4.6.1. During training and competition days, all divers must hold a valid Portuguese licence for spearfishing. Under the law, recreational spearfishing anglers may catch up to 10 kg of fish + 1 additional largest specimen.
- 4.6.2. The organisation, the Port Authority or other competent authorities may inspect boats. The organisation strongly recommends compliance with the Recreational Boating Law and Sports Fishing in general and Spearfishing in particular.
- 4.6.3. Non-compliance with the law will result in expulsion from the competition, seizure of fishing equipment, as well as administrative and financial penalties.
- 4.6.4. Portuguese spearfishing fishing licences can be obtained online, at ATMs. Teams may request assistance from the organisation in obtaining licences with a fee to be defined.



5. RULES AND INTERPRETATION

The CMAS general rules for Spearfishing will be used as reference for any matter not addressed in this Information Bulletin.

6. PERMITTED EQUIPMENT

- 6.1. The use of an official buoy provided by the LOC is mandatory for all competitor teams who are at sea during competition days. Only one buoy per team is to be provided/used.
- 6.2. In the event of loss of the official buoy, the competitor team will request a replacement official buoy from the organisation, during that period, the competitor team must use their own buoy of similar dimensions.
- 6.3. Only the following equipment is permitted:
 - 6.3.1. One boat per team.
 - 6.3.2. Spearguns, loaded by the athlete themselves, without assistance from another competitor or persons on board.
 - 6.3.3. Spearfishing fins.
 - 6.3.4. Mask.
 - 6.3.5. Snorkel.
 - 6.3.6. Weight belt with quick-release system.
 - 6.3.7. Additional weight, provided it is always recovered from the seabed.
 - 6.3.8. Gloves.
 - 6.3.9. Fish carrier on the buoy.
 - 6.3.10. Spare spears and tips.
 - 6.3.11. Watch and dive computer.
 - 6.3.12. Echo sounder.
 - 6.3.13. Wetsuit.
 - 6.3.14. Knife.
 - 6.3.15. Use of a cooler/thermal box to keep catches fresh is recommended.
 - 6.3.16. Communication devices (mobile phones, VHF radios, walkie-talkies, etc.).
 - 6.3.17. GPS (Global Positioning System).
 - 6.3.18. Portable scales.
 - 6.3.19. Underwater torch/spotlight.
 - 6.3.20. Safety vest* approved by CMAS.



7. PROHIBITED EQUIPMENT/BEHAVIOUR

- 7.1. Carry fish on the belt or anywhere other than the buoy or the boat.
- 7.2. Be towed by the boat in the water against the current.
- 7.3. Keep a loaded speargun/weapon out of the water.
- 7.4. Hang loaded spearguns/weapons on buoys.
- 7.5. Use compressed air for breathing from any type of device or container.

8. COMPETITION

- 8.1. All team members must wear identical uniform, consisting at least of a shirt and shorts/trousers.
- 8.2. Each team will receive a numbered official signal buoy at the time of registration. The use of this buoy is mandatory during competition days. Athletes may not move more than 25 metres from their official team buoy.
- 8.3. The LOC will provide each team with numbered bags or numbered wire to store the fish caught, which will be sealed by the officials and handed in at the designated catch collection point at the end of each competition day, or at the time the team decides to withdraw from the event. In that case, the team is obliged to communicate this intention to the CMAS Technical Delegate before leaving the competition area.
- 8.4. Each boat will be identified with a number and the respective country and club initials, as well as the team number and country flag, in accordance with the CMAS General Regulations.
- 8.5. Teams consisting of three athletes: During spearfishing competition period, only two athletes may be in the water at the same time. It is not permitted for all three to be in the water simultaneously. They must maintain at all time a maximum distance of 25 metres from the team buoy. If all divers except one exit the water to board the boat, the remaining athlete may continue spearfishing. If two athletes of the same team have to abandon the competition for any reason (fatigue, injury, etc.), the remaining athlete may not continue alone.
- 8.6. The World Cup Technical Official boat will lead the displacement of boats and competitors to the concentration point determined at the captains' technical meeting, located in the centre of the competition zone. The World Cup Technical Official boat will leave the departure port, followed by the team boats, until reaching the concentration point, where the start signal will be given through visual and sound signals.
- 8.7. All boats must follow the World Cup Technical Official boat, both going to and returning from the competition zone.
- 8.8. After all boats have arrived at the concentration point, a new count of participants will be carried out and the start and end times of the fishing competition will be communicated.
- 8.9. The concentration point and the time margins for arrival at it and passing through control after the end of fishing time will also be communicated at that point.
- 8.10. At the end of the competition period, the Technical Delegate will signal the end in the same way, through sound and visual signals. Competitors' boats must arrive at the exact control/concentration point within 15 minutes of the end of competition time. The CMAS Technical Delegate may set a different margin if sea conditions justify it.



- 8.11. Penalty for delays are applied by CMAS TD in accordance with the CMAS general rules.
- 8.12. The movement of boats during the competition, throughout the entire zone, must be done at reduced speed, maintaining prudent distances from other athletes and their buoys, respecting a 50-metre radius to other teams' identification buoys.

9. TECHNICAL ISSUES

- 9.1. All situations not provided for in these rules must be resolved in accordance with CMAS international spearfishing rules.
- 9.2. For events not provided for in the Information Bulletin or in the General Regulations, the decision will be made and resolved by the CMAS Technical Delegate for the World Cup.
- 9.3. The LOC may also be consulted by the CMAS Technical Delegate for specialised advice at any time, but the CMAS Technical Delegate will always make their own decisions.
- 9.4. If a competitor feels fatigued or if other circumstances require the athlete to abandon the competition, the team must communicate the situation by the swiftest way to the CMAS Technical Delegate. The team consisting of three athletes may resume the competition after disembarking the withdrawing athlete at the dock or transferring them to the medical boat, but the team must communicate their returning to the competition to the CMAS Technical Delegate.
- 9.5. A team must end the competition if only one athlete remains after the withdrawal of the others.
- 9.6. During the competition, the competition official boat will have flags with the following colours:
 - 9.6.1. RED: Emergency / Urgency
 - 9.6.2. WHITE: End of competition
 - 9.6.3. GREEN: Request for mechanical assistance
- 9.7. After the white flag and sound signal, all competitors must stop fishing activity and board the boat. If they are in the water, they must stop fishing and swim to the boat.



10. PENALTIES

- 10.1. Infractions are reported by any member of the refereeing team to the Technical Delegate, who shall apply the penalties to the offending athlete(s) in accordance with CMAS general rules.

11. COMPLAINTS

- 11.1. Participants have the right to submit a complaint to the International Jury.
11.2. Only the Team Captain may submit the complaint.
11.3. All complaints must be accompanied by a deposit of 100 EUROS, as set by CMAS.
11.4. The complaint must be submitted in writing to the CMAS TD, in English, French or Spanish, within the indicated periods.

11.5. Complaints Procedure

- 11.5.1. Complaints must be submitted within specific periods:
- a. Before the weigh-in
 - b. During the weigh-in
 - c. Classification error – the complaint must be communicated to the Competition Director (with the €100 deposit) within 15 minutes of the publication of the classification, to allow postponement of the award ceremony.
- 11.5.2. Written submission deadline – once the oral intention to complain has been communicated to the International Judge, there is a fixed 1 hour to complete and submit the complaint form. Otherwise, the complaint will be null and void, and the deposit will not be refunded.
- 11.5.3. The complaint will be considered valid if all requirements are met.
- 11.5.4. The deposit of 100 EUROS will be refunded if the complaint is accepted.

12. SCORING AND CLASSIFICATION

12.1. The calculation will be carried out in two phases:

1st Phase: Classical Score (CS):

The athlete's classical score is obtained by adding the total score to the total bonus and subtracting the total penalties.

2nd Phase: Percentage Score (PS):

- a. The classical score shall be converted into a percentage score by calculating each team's CS as a percentage of the CS of the team with the highest score.
- b. The team with the highest CS in the round shall be awarded 100 percentage points (%), and all the other teams shall receive a corresponding percentage value, rounded to the third decimal place.
- c. In the event of a tie in percentage score, the tie shall be broken using the classical score. If the tie persists, it shall be broken by the less number of fish caught.
- d. Athletes are required to comply with the applicable legislation regarding minimum sizes, number of specimens, closed seasons, as well as prohibitions on capture.

12.2. Valid species and their respective minimum and maximum weights, bonuses, and penalties:

12.2.1. Valid species are divided into four groups.

12.2.2. For Groups 1, 2, and 3, scoring by weight is obtained by assigning one point or one and a half points per gram to valid specimens, according to the attached table, with a maximum of 12,500 points per specimen.

12.2.3. The bonus per valid specimen in these three groups is equivalent, in points, to the minimum valid weight (in grams) of Group 1, i.e., 500 points.

12.2.4. For Group 4, there is only a bonus per valid specimen caught, with no scoring by weight. The bonus is defined according to the attached table:

- a. Bonus per captured specimen of Conger eel (Safio) and Moray eel (Moreia) = 2,000 points.
- b. Bonus per captured specimen of Trigger Fish (Peixe-porco) = 1,000 points.

12.2.5. Only the species explicitly listed in the groups are considered valid.

12.2.6. An additional bonus of 1,000 points shall be awarded for each different valid species captured.

12.2.7. An additional bonus of 1,000 points shall be awarded for each species for which the "quota" (maximum number of valid specimens) is reached.

12.2.8. If the maximum number of specimens of a species is exceeded, the team shall be penalized by removing the excess number from the largest specimen(s) of that species.

12.2.9. Specimens presented for weighing that are below 2/3 of the species minimum weight, rounded up by 5 grams, shall be penalized.

12.2.10. The penalty applied to catches below the 2/3 of the minimum weight is the same points of the minimum weight for that species in grams.



13. SAFETY PLAN AND EMERGENCY & EVACUATION PROCEDURE

The LOC will provide a **Safety Plan** including the means and criteria in CMAS Safety List and the **Emergency and Evacuation procedure** approved by CMAS Technical Delegate by 2 weeks before event.
